This year the Feast and Show promises to be an event that will bring summer fun to the village over an even greater extended period of time. We have endeavoured to time the start of the Scarecrow Competition with the summer judging for 'Yorkshire in Bloom' and other groups in the village are beginning to see this period in the village calendar as a good time to put on events of their own - a most welcome development. It is always wonderful to see the village alive with folk viewing the Scarecrows and attempting the Feast Family Treasure Hunt on the sunny evenings and weekend leading up to the Feast and Show itself.

This year also sees the 50th birthday of the Brownies and to celebrate this our own pack will be putting on activities for Feast Sunday. In September, the 1st Hampsthwaite Guides which will start and there is a growing waiting list for both Brownies and Guides - see the information stand on Feast Sunday.

Kachale Village Update

FEAST FOR KACHALE



Great things are happening in Kachale Village this year. Three more families have been moved in to their new homes, we've built a hammer mill for the villagers to grind their maize, sunk another borehole, given out 600 school bags from children in Britain and we are expecting a mobile clinic from Canada. The last remaining house is serving as a temporary school for the 18 younger, village children. And Fostina Mwanamwonga, our energetic teacher/manager, is already doing great things with the few educational resources we have managed to provide.



And now, thanks to the continued and generous support of Hampsthwaite Feast, we have started building the new school. The site, by the huge Kachale tree, has been waiting for this moment for some time, as have the 200 very needy children, in surrounding villages, who also wait for an education. Regrettably, I had to delay my Spring visit to Zambia but will be out there in time to receive the resources we've just shipped out and to find staff ready for the grand opening of our Kachale School in October.



Hampsthwaite Village's efforts in supporting 'School for Africa' have already made a tremendous difference to these children. They not only have a secure and growing village but the prospects of a proper schooling. And more importantly they now have laughter in their souls and a hope for the future. A huge 'thank you' to all the Hampsthwaite supporters.

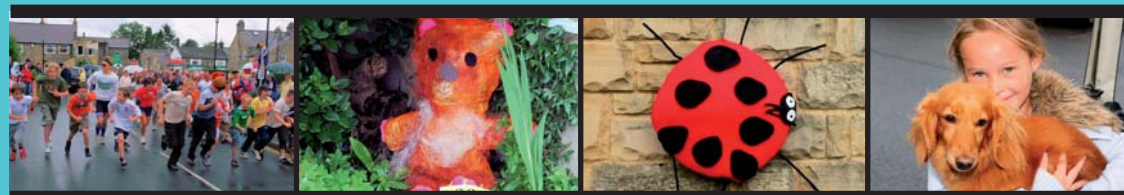

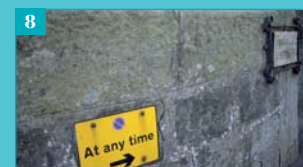
